4-H Enrollments

It's time to get enrolled for the new 4-H year. **Even if you are enrolling in the same projects, you will still need to log-on and update.**

There will be a \$15 fee per member payable to the KS 4-H program as you enroll. **Your enrollment is not considered complete until you hit the SUBMIT button.** You can pay by credit card or by check to the State 4-H Office. **Payments do not come to the local Extension Office.** If this fee is a hardship for your family, you can select the "Request a Waiver" button and the State 4-H Office will consider your request.

You will be able to add projects or delete them from your list of enrollments until May 1 for all areas, **except Livestock projects**. **Those need to be enrolled prior to the weigh-in and identification date set for each specie**. I.e. Market Beef is usually weighed in early February and Small Livestock weighed in late April.

VIP (Volunteer Information Profile)

Each 4-H volunteer working directly with youth in the club, is required to go through this screening and training process. The application is available from your club leader or on the <u>Ellis 4-H website</u>. Aps can be submitted at any time during the next few months, but the screening and training process <u>must be completed by January 1</u>.

National Background Checks—Kansas 4-H requires national background checks for all volunteers. 1/3 of our 120 current VIP volunteers will go through this process this year. Your club leader has this list and will be contacting you to complete this process now. All volunteers will be required to go through this process every 3 years.

Current Volunteers - If you are a current screened volunteer in your 4-H club and plan to continue to do so, please complete and return your <u>VIP Renewal Form</u> to the Extension Office <u>ASAP</u>. These are available from your club leader or can be found on-line at www.kansas4-h.org and click on the Volunteer link for a form-fillable version.

New & Returning Volunteers – will need to add yourself to your family profile in 4-H On-line. Visit with your club's leader or our office if you need assistance with this!

Citizenship in Action

What: Would you like to have more influence in laws and rules that affect your life? Then you'll want to go to Kansas 4-H Citizenship in Action! This two day event is sponsored by the State 4-H Youth Leadership Council. The purpose of the event is for Kansas youth to learn how the state legislative process works and how their voice and participation in decision-making can make a difference in

their local communities. The legislative visit will not only familiarize youth with the capitol building, but will also show them how they can affect the legislative process.

When: February 17 – 18, 2019

Where: Topeka, KS

Who: Youth 13-18 years old by January 1 of the current year

Registration Deadline: January 15, 2019

Last Call for Citizenship Washington Focus – Spaces still available!

Road trip across the USA stopping to see Philadelphia, Gettysburg, the Liberty Bell and more! Meet, learn, share and tour with youth from other states and respected resource people. Walk among places that have made history and places that are making news today. Visit Capitol Hill, government departments, historic sites, and memorials. Get a close-up view of political process through visits to Capitol Hill. Meet with the Kansas Congressional and Senate delegations to discuss legislative issues. Participate in workshops and assembly groups to learn life skills and discuss possible solutions to domestic and international problems. Interact with 4-H members from other states, learning and sharing about 4-H and other interests and issues. This trip has filled up quickly in the last few years; make sure that you do not delay in signing up to attend! Cost is \$1850.

When: June 13-24, 2019 Where: Washington D.C.

Who: Youth 15-18 years old by January 1 of the current year

How: Apply to the Ellis Co. Ext. Office by December 3. Interviews to be held soon after this date.

KS 4-H Scholarships Due in Early 2019

Get an early start on your application for the <u>2019 Kansas 4-H Scholarship</u>. They are due in the local Extension Office in late January each year. Current college students and graduating seniors are eligible to apply. A list of scholarships available to apply for will come out closer to the end of the year.

New in 2019

Youth showing in state livestock shows will be required to take a Youth for the Quality Care of Animals (YQCA) training. This is available on the web and is valid for one year. Cost is \$12. Visit yqca.org to get trained.
