YQCA Training – April 7th 1:30 pm at the Ag Research Center If you will be participating in the YQCA training on April 7th, please complete the Pre-Test on the website yqcaprogram.org. All youth who plan to sale at the Ellis County 4-H Livestock Auction, exhibit in the Kansas State Fair Grand Drive and/or KJLS should complete the training at their earliest convenience. <u>This includes Meat Pen</u> Rabbits, Meat Pen Poultry, Market Steers, Market Heifers, Feeder Calves, Meat

<u>Goats, Swine and Sheep.</u> This is an annual training, so youth need to complete it each year. You will have the option to do the training on line at \$12 per member or in person on April 7th for \$3. Following the training there will be a Livestock sale meeting.

Please visit yqcaprogram.org to register for this class and pay the \$3.00 fee. NO money will be collected at the door that evening. You MUST be enrolled and complete the pre-test BEFORE the class!! Once you finish the class, print off a copy and save it in a file for future reference.

2024 Insect Art Contest

The Kansas State Pesticide Safety and IPM program is hosting an insect-themed art contest for Kansas 4-Her's and art students as well as adults. This year the artwork needs to fit into the contest theme of "Incognito: Insects in Disguise." The goal is to explore how and why insects camouflage or imitate. **Entries should be postmarked by April 15, 2024.**

Selected artwork will be used to create educational items. Artists that have art selected will receive a certificate and a prize to recognize their achievement. We will select a winner from each of the outlined categories and one overall winner will be selected from those entries.

4-H HORSE ID PAPERS DUE MAY 1

Horse ID papers are available at the Extension Office or on line at <u>kansas4-h.org</u>. You have to have these papers completed and on <u>file with our office by May 1</u> in order to show at 4-H sanctioned horse shows. Now's the time to get the photos taken and the forms filed with the Extension Office. *If you have an old form, you should transition to the form linked above it was updated in 2023.*



Small Livestock Weigh-in Date Set for May 1st, 6 – 8 p.m.

If you're planning to show Feeder Calves, Meat Goats, Sheep or Swine at this year's Ellis County Fair, make plans now to get your official 4-H tags and tag your project animals before the weigh-in at the Fairgrounds. All market animals have the option to weigh their animals. Tags must be verified at weigh-in. The Ellis Co. Spring Livestock Show has been set as an alternate weigh-in date on Sunday, May 7th, 7 – 9 a.m. *Please call our office to let*

us know if you plan to use the alternate date. Remember, you need to be enrolled in the Market livestock project by May 1. <u>Bucket Calf</u> & <u>Commercial Breeding Heifer</u> forms due in Ext. Office by 5PM on May 1st.

Club Fundraising Opportunity – Wheat Plot Tour Meal

Each year we hold and conduct a county wheat plot tour/field day near the end of May/early June. After the field day we come into Hays to the Municipal Park, 1st and Main Street for dinner. Any 4-H club in the county can throw their clubs name in the hat to prepare and serve the meal. Stacy will go out and get the donations and the 4-H club will receive the donated money after the event. The meal has generally consisted of grilled hamburgers and brats with the condiments, pickles, onions, chips, baked beans or potato salad, a dessert, water, tea, and lemonade (optional). We are encouraging people to RSVP, so we will give the club an estimated head count closer to the date.

State Livestock Nominations

Detailed Information on this whole process are posted on the <u>K-State Youth Livestock webpage</u>. Now that we are using an online system, families are encouraged to plan ahead, use the resources posted, and check out the <u>Rookie Guide</u>. Cost per animal is \$12.00. Exhibitors who nominated animals last year (in 2023) need to use their existing ShoWorks account. Those who need help accessing their account may request a password reset through ShoWorks or contact the Youth Livestock Program for assistance. Returning exhibitors should not create a new account. All market animals and commercial breeding females that families would like to be eligible to show at the Kansas State Fair Grand Drive and/or KJLS must be nominated.
