The Thursday evening class (approx 6:00 - 8:30 pm) will be held at Straubs and Saturday the class will be at Barton Community College. The class is intended for 13-16 year olds.

There is a \$15 charge for the class to help pay for a workbook and other costs. Lunch will be provided. Put this date on your calendar and get your registration in soon.

If youth age 14-15 are planning to do farm work for someone other than their parents per the Dept. of Labor requirements, they must take a tractor safety course. The class is open to anyone 13-18 years of age.

Can I join 4-H now?

As you know, December 1 is the deadline for all returning 4-H members to re-enroll and March 1 is the deadline to get new members enrolled. By now, the 4-H year is half over and there have been lots of club and county activities.

We understand that some families may not be aware of the deadlines set (the first year they join). So, we are doing our best to accommodate everyone and at this time, if a member enrolls after the deadline, the 4-H member and a parent will be asked to sign a second chance form that verifies that "yes, I know this is after the deadline and next year I will not have this second chance opportunity".

MAY 1 is a drop/add deadline for all project changes.

Mowing Project

The Holding Board would be willing to make a donation of \$150 (each mowing) to a 4-H Club if they would be interested in mowing the 4-H Grounds. This would include picking up trash and weed eating. It could be a different 4-H club each month (May, June, July and August). Please give the Extension office (793-1910) a call if your club might be interested and we will pass your name on to the Holding Board members.

Holding Board Update

The Barton County 4-H Holding board was originally set up to hold property for the 4-H program. They are tasked with taking care of and making decisions about the buildings and the 4-H grounds between Great Bend and Hoisington.

4-H Council pays \$2500 each year to have use of the building throughout the year. To use the building for 4-H purposes your club or project group must still contact the Extension office to put your date on the calendar. There may be times that the building will be rented and because we need the rent money to pay the bills we may ask a 4-H group to change their location, etc, but normally 4-H has priority.

4-H is also responsible for their own clean up just like those who rent it. All families involved in the activity or the club must help clean up.

Horse ID Papers May 1st Deadline

Horse Identification forms are available at the Extension Office and online. The easiest way to get to all horse information is to go to www.kansas 4-h.org and on the purple bar at the top, click on projects and scroll down to "horse".

If you are using the same horse as last year, the ID can be signed again and dated. However, please read the specific information about the ID guidelines when you head to District and State. There is a sample ID posted. It needs to be printed on one piece of paper front and back. Remember, we need pictures as stated on the horse ID papers.

If you plan to compete at district horse show, you need to have passed the appropriate knowledge and skill test by May 30th. The South Central District horse show will be held on July 10, 2018 at the Kansas State Fairgrounds in Hutchinson. Entry is due June 1 AND no late entries will be accepted.

Important Date - May 5th

Market Animal Weigh-in Deadline

As stated in the fair book, all market animals to be shown at the Barton County Fair in the 4-H classes must be identified on before the Official Weigh Date. Not reading the newsletter or not getting your animals on time is not an acceptable excuse.

You are to have the animal in your possession by May 1 and the "official weigh-in date" is Saturday May 5th but there will not be an official weigh in at the 4-H grounds as in the past. All market goats, market lambs and market hogs must still be eartagged by this date. Please contact Alicia Boor at the Extension office about getting your market animals eartagged by May 5th.

If you are not presently enrolled in the livestock project you must get the project added to your enrollment by May 1st at 4-H Online.

Market Livestock Sale Guidelines

In order to sell through the Sale of Champions at the Barton County fair, the 4-H member must:

- ♦ Attend a livestock quality assurance training annually or pass the written PQA test.
- ♦ Attend a minimum of five 4-H club meetings during the year.
- ♦ Turn in a medication form that includes the eartag number of the animal and a complete list of all medications that have been used since the animal was purchased. The form is to be turned in at the livestock check in when you enter the fairgrounds so please be prepared.
- ♦ Deliver BBQ tickets to previous livestock buyers before the scheduled date.
- ♦ Show your animal AND walk your animal through the ring at the Sale of Champions

ALL Livestock Projects must be in your sole ownership by May 1, 2018 for you to be eligible to exhibit at the county fair, state fair, & other shows. Some shows will require registration papers on registered animals & they must be in the name of the 4-H member. Please read the Barton County Fairbook from cover to cover.

Dates for Spring Shows

We are receiving flyers from across the state about spring shows for livestock. IF you would like those forwarded to you by email, please send a note to bunruh@ksu.edu. We do not print each of these out as we receive them, so if you come into the Extension Office it would really take some time to print them on demand.

KJLS/KSF Livestock Nomination

Berny forwarded information to those who have expressed an interest in showing at the Kansas State Fair or KJLS. If you did <u>not</u> receive an email from Berny please ask for more information or go this website and read on!

2018 Livestock Nomination guidelines include:

- * DNA hair samples required for each nominated animal for ALL species.
- * All nominated animals must have an EID tag. On the forms, there is a place to place the EID sticker.
- * All Market steer/ heifer nominations are due May 1.
- * All other species and commercial animal nominations are due June 15.
- *There is an annual fee. This is for nominations that have to be returned to the family for any reason.




