Market Beef animals must be weighed in on Saturday, March 3rd from 9-10:30 pm at Animal Medical Center.

All market goat, sheep and swine MUST be eartagged by an agent and information recorded by May 5th. Please contact Alicia to set a time for eartagging. Her email is <u>aboor@ksu.edu</u> or call the Extension Office at 793-1910. Please remind other 4-H members about this important deadline.

Important Deadlines for Livestock for State 4-H Shows

May 1st: Horse I.D.s and Vaccine Forms Due Beef DNA/nominations for KJLS and KSF

- June 15th: DNA/nominations for sheep, swine and goats due for the KSF and KJLS
- July 15th: Entry deadline for the Kansas State Fair for Beef, Sheep and Swine. Entries are different than the nomination process.

All Livestock Projects must be purchased & in sole ownership of the 4-H member by May 1, 2018 (or in the case of beef market animals, by March 3rd) to be eligible to show at the county fair. Read the fair or show guidelines for specific details especially for the Kansas State Fair and KJLS. Some shows will require registration papers on registered animals and they must be in the name of the 4-H member.

Livestock Quality Assurance March 22 at 2 pm

All 4-H Livestock members must attend a livestock quality assurance meeting in order to sell at the Barton County Fair livestock sale. The first meeting offered will be Thursday, March 22, 2018 at 2 pm at the Extension Office meeting room. There will be a \$3 charge to be certified.

Another meeting will be scheduled in May. IF you are unable to attend on of the scheduled meetings, you will take the online class. Alicia will share the link and information. The cost of the online class is \$12.

Livestock committee members met February 19th. The goal of 4-H and of the livestock projects is to gain knowledge about the livestock industry and also to grow and develop personal skills.

Remember that in order to sell a market animal through the Sale of Champions, members are required to:

* attend a minimum of one educational livestock quality assurance meeting.

* attend a minimum of five 4-H club meetings for the 2017-2018 year. Don't wait!

* complete and turn in a medication record for each animal **at the time the animal is checked in** at the county fair.

* return documentation to the Ext. Office that BBQ tickets have been delivered to the previous year's buyer

* turn in the intent-to-sell form to the Fair Office one hour after the member's last livestock show
* and the member must be present at the Sale of Champions and walk the animal through the ring.

Livestock Leadership Academy Applications due March 30

The 2018 K-State Animal Sciences Leadership Academy (KASLA) will be held June 6-9, 2018 in Manhattan, KS. The KASLA is designed to educate youth about the livestock industry through an engaging summer experience hosted by K-State Animal Sciences and Industry. WOOL!

How do you fit a sheep, rabbit, and a goat in your microwave? How do you fit a camel in your crockpot? What do the Portuguese and Turkish have in common? Come find out at fiber fun day! It's a colorful event to dye for that will have your heads and hands spinning! Come explore wool fibers with Laura Dinke!

Learn about the process of taking wool from animals, preparing it, dying it, spinning it into yarn. Try your hand at needle felting during the workshop, too.

Fiber Arts Service Project

Help create some special fiber projects that we will share with those in need.

Horse Hair Braiding

Tatum Sprague-Kimzey will lead us in learning the fine

in learning the fine art of horse hair braiding. Each participant in this class will learn to make "pulls" from horse tail hair and then braid a four part braid to make a bracelet to take home with you. If you would like to use hair from your horse please take a small amount of the longest hair from the center of the tail. You will only need approximately a pencil diameters worth.

Easter Needle Felting

Design fantastic wool creations using raw carded wool and a special barbed needle. It's simple, inexpensive, and you can fashion just about anything you can imagine. Start small until you get the hang of needle felting. Your choice of a bunny, chick or Easter egg will be our project for the day.

Sioux Beaded Pens

A traditional Sioux Indian craft using seed beads and the peyote stitch to create a cool pen cover.

So Simple Sewing

Learn some basic sewing skills and make a simple travel organizer out of a striped washcloth. Everyone needs to learn to sew just a little bit and this project is a perfect project for the beginner.

Knots, Knots & More Knots!

You won't believe it, but the design of the most *macramé* works is built up from the different combinations of a few basic *knots*! Once you become familiar with these *knots*, you will be able to create absolutely any project you want!

CD Weaving

Learn weaving basics with these colorful cd based projects. We'll use completely recyclable items to create this one of a kind wall hanging.
