What is a 4-H Water Ambassador?



The 4-H Water Ambassador program is a leadership opportunity for teens 13 and older, focusing on the importance of water quality, water conservation and water careers. It is a pilot project for teens in the Cottonwood Extension District.

If selected, the first step will be to attend two (2) training sessions on January 9 (Hays) and February 20, 2021 (Great Bend). This team of trained teens will be expected to return to their communities and lead other young people in water educational activities at one or more of the following:

- World Water Day Fun Fest at Sternberg Museum (tentatively, March 23 or 25, 2021)
- Wetlands Education Center Earth Day Celebration
- Crossroads Exhibit event at Hays Public Library
- Afterschool programs
- o 4-H Club meetings
- County Fair displays at the Barton and Ellis County Fairs
- Other activities where youth are willing to learn!

Youth involved with the 2021 4-H Water Ambassador Team will:

- Learn about the water cycle
- Learn about ways to conserve water
- Learn about using drones to view water sources and land use
- Learn how everyone can contribute to caring for our shared water resource
- Learn about potential careers in water
- Learn ways to use social media, videos and other technology platforms to spread the word about the importance of our water resource.
