KANSAS STATE FAIR

Congrats to all 4-H'ers who exhibited or participated in this year's fair. There were a number of personal "bests" at the event. Way to represent, Ellis Co. 4-H'ers!!!

KANSAS STATE FAIR EXHIBITS

Watch the Hays Arts Council Main street window for your state fair exhibits to be on display starting October 2nd through the 20th. Exhibits that are on display for National 4-H week will be at the Achievement Banquet on October 28th for pick up. After that, they will return to the Extension Office. **We ask that everything be picked up by November 3rd.**

4-H ENROLLMENTS

Welcome to the New 4-H year! The 4-H Online enrollment system is open now to update your enrollment choices for 2023 - 24. Even if you are enrolling in the same projects, you will still need to log-on and update your profile and make project selections.

The \$15 fee per member is payable to the KS 4-H program as you enroll. Your enrollment is not considered complete until you make a payment and hit the **SUBMIT** button. You can pay by credit card or by check to the State 4-H Office. **Payments do not come to the local Extension Office**. If this fee is a hardship for your family, you can select the "Request a Waiver" button and the State 4-H Office will consider your request.

We ask that you take time this month to complete this process and have everything finalized by December 1.

You will be able to add projects or delete them from your list of enrollments until May 1 for all areas, **except Livestock projects**. Those need to be enrolled prior to the weigh-in and identification date set for each specie. I.e. Market Beef is usually weighed in early February and Small Livestock weighed in late April/early May.

VIP (Volunteer Information Profile)

4-H volunteers working directly with youth in the club, as a leader or project leader are required to go through this screening and training process. The application is available as part of the 4-H On-line website. You will complete a profile for yourself under your family account. Take part in the training modules available on that site.

Contact the Ext. Office to let us know you've completed these steps and schedule an interview. At that time, we will provide you with a link to the background check process. Aps can be submitted at any time during the next few months, but the screening and training process must be completed by January 1.

National Background Checks—Kansas 4-H requires national background checks for all volunteers. 1/3 of our 100+ current VIP volunteers will go through this process this year. Your club leader has this list and will be contacting you to complete this process now. All volunteers will be required to go through this process every 3 years.

Current Volunteers - If you are a current screened volunteer in your 4-H club and plan to continue to do so, please **UPDATE YOUR INFORMATION** on the 4-H On-line system as your complete **VIP Renewal Form by November 1**.

New & Returning Volunteers – will need to add yourself to your family profile in 4-H On-line. Visit with your club's leader or our office if you need assistance with this!

MANDATORY YQCA FOR 2024 ELLIS CO. FAIR SALE

The Cottonwood District Extension Board and the Ellis County Fair Board have agreed that the YQCA program is important. To be able to participate in the 2024 Ellis County 4-H Livestock Auction, all youth must complete the YQCA program and attend the mandatory sale information meeting. We will be planning to offer both in the spring time, watch for more information to come.

YQCA is designed as an annual education and certification program focused on food safety, animal well-being and character awareness for youth ages 8 to 21 producing and/or showing pigs, beef cattle, dairy cattle, sheep, goats, rabbits, and poultry. The program has been designed by extension specialists and national livestock program managers to ensure it is accurate, current and relevant to the needs of the animal industry and shows and is appropriate for youth.

AS EACH 4-H YEAR BEGINS, REMEMBER...

- 4-H youth are more important than the project exhibit itself.
- Learning how to do a project is more important than the project itself. To "learn by doing" through a useful project is fundamental in any sound educational program, and is characteristic of the 4-H program.
- There is more than one good way of doing most things.
- Our job is to teach 4-H members how to think, not what to think.
- Winning isn't always measured by the results of the ribbon or judging event, but by the character of the 4-H'er, parent and leader.
