Small Livestock Weigh-in Date Set for May 1, 6 – 8 p.m.

If you're planning to show Feeder Calves, Meat Goats, Sheep or Swine at this year's Ellis County Fair, make plans now to get your official 4-H tags and tag your project animals before the weigh-in at the Fairgrounds. Swine will continue to have to option to weigh or have their tags visually inspected. The Ellis Co. Spring Livestock Show has been set as an alternate weigh-in date on Sunday, May 5, 7-9 a.m. *Please call our office to let us know if you plan to use the alternate date.*

Attention Ellis County 4-H Market Animal Participants (Large and Small Animals)

If you plan to take your 4-H market animal through the livestock sale at the Ellis County Fair, you will be required by the Ellis County Fairboard to attend a livestock marketing meeting. Meat Goat Workshop and Livestock Judging Contest - March 23

We've added an additional class to the Saturday morning line up. Jeff Neher, Countywide Meat Goat project leader will be holding a Meat Goat Care, Selection and Showmanship Clinic from 9:30 – 11 a.m. 2nd Floor Albertson Hall. Please pre-register for this class and others on the <u>registration form</u> by Friday, March 15. If you plan to judge Livestock in the afternoon, it would be helpful if you registered ahead for this activity, too. Walk-ins are welcome, but you won't have to wait as long if you take the time to register now.

KS JR Meat Goat Producer Day

Junior Meat Goat Producer Day will be hosted on Saturday, March 30, 2019 in Weber Arena on the K-State campus in Manhattan. This one-day educational event is devoted to the selection and management of youth meat goat projects. All ages and knowledge levels are invited! K-State faculty members, graduate students, and guest speakers will cover topics including selection, meat science, nutrition, the state nomination process, herd health, reproduction, health and wellness, facilities and equipment, and showmanship.

The cost for junior meat goat producer day is \$15/person, if registration is submitted by March 11, 2019, or \$20/person after the early deadline. All attendees, including youth and adults, must register. All participants who sign up by Mach 11 will also receive a t-shirt. Families may register online at http://bit.ly/ksuasiregister, or by downloading the flyer (http://bit.ly/ksujrproducerdays), completing the bottom portion of the flyer and mailing it, with payment, to the K-State Youth Livestock Program.

An optional instructor-led YQCA session will also be held at the conclusion of the program. Those who indicate they would like to participate in the optional YQCA certification will receive additional details and instructions via email in late March. The junior producer day fee does not include the cost of the YQCA class; families will need to sign up through the YQCA site and pay the \$3.00 separately.

Science of Agriculture Challenge Coming to Kansas 4-H

It's a hands-on learning experience to inspire the next generation of agriculture leaders in Kansas. Teams of 3-5 youth in grades 6-12 work with volunteer coaches and mentors to create projects and develop solutions. As a team, you'll identify agriculture-related issues in your community, find solutions and share your projects with your community. Each summer, teams present their ideas to a panel of industry expert judges at a state competition. Each member of the top three teams receives a scholarship! If you'd like to be part of a team, give the Extension Office a call.

K-State Animal Sciences Leadership Academy

The eighth annual K-State Animal Sciences Leadership Academy will be held in June 2018 at Kansas State University's campus. This four-day event focuses on increasing knowledge of Kansas's diverse livestock industry, as well as building participant's leadership skills. Twenty high school students will be selected to participate based upon educational, community, and agricultural involvement. The event is sponsored by the Livestock and Meat Industry Council.
