The Countdown to County Fair is ON! This is the "Official Fair Edition" of the 4-H Newsletter. Read on to learn more about what's happening at this year's Ellis County Fair.

Fair entry deadline for Livestock, Horse, Small Animals and Clothing Buymanship/Fashion Revue project areas is Friday, June 28 this year ALL OTHER entries (and the ones you've submitted via the paper process) in 4-H & Open Class will need to be entered into the new system by JULY 8. We will be using the same Fair entry process on-line this year. Check out the video and handout about how to make your entries on the Ellis Co. 4-H – Events – Ellis County Fair page.

If you are enrolled in Photography, Visual Arts and Clothing Construction projects, you will find the judging schedule for these projects on the <u>Fair website</u>. If for some reason, you are not able to participate at the scheduled time, please contact our office ASAP. Thanks.

Foods Judging times - you will go <u>on-line</u> and select your time to visit with a judge about your food projects. Please make your selections **by Monday, July 8.** Look for details on how to do this elsewhere in this letter.

You pick the times and the jobs that work best for your family. Please take time to sign up by July 8. Look for details on how to do this elsewhere in this letter.

Livestock Pre-entry for Ellis Co. Fair Pre-entry forms, picture forms, insurance forms will be due on June 28. At this time all animals must be designated to a 4-H'ers name. Be sure you go on-line and enter ALL of your participation by July 8.

Herdsmanship Award

Commerce Bank has agreed to sponsor cash awards for Herdsmanship in livestock & small animal barns again this year. **Be sure to thank them when you see a bank representative**. Herdsmanship includes keeping your stalls, tie outs and tack areas clean, making sure your animals are fed & watered during the fair. It also includes decorating your club's area, posting stall cards for all exhibits and helping to educate the visitors to the barn about livestock projects.

This year's fair theme is "Follow the Fairground Road". What creative ways can your club use this theme in making your barn area look great during the fair?

If your club won in 2018, your club's project leader will receive a barn map. Please mark your preferences on the map and return it to the Extension Office with your club's preferred location in the barn by the July 8 fair entry deadline.

Barn Clean Up & Manure Wagon Unloading During the Fair

The Ellis Co. Fairboard is asking that each club take a turn removing trash from containers around the 3 barns during the week of the Fair and emptying the manure wagon. Livestock Photos are Tuesday

Something NEW this year... you will sign up to have your livestock photos taken early Tuesday morning or right after lunch. <u>Go to the on-line link</u> to schedule for morning or afternoon. There are limited slots available for both timeframes. **You must get your photo taken during these times if you intend to sell an animal in the sale.**

The 4-H Livestock Sweepstakes is set for August 24-25 on KSU campus. This all-around event will feature contests in Livestock Judging, Meats Judging, Livestock Skill-a-thon, and Livestock Quiz Bowl. A special prize will be awarded to the county that does the best in all four contests.

Ellis County's team consideration, will be based on your scores from the County Fair judging contest. Entries are due to the Extension Office by Thursday, July 25.

Cat Proof of Vaccination for County Fair

Cats & kittens (over 2 months of age) shown at the Ellis Co. Fair must be current on rabies and distemper vaccinations. Be prepared to provide proof of vaccination at show check in.

Required Poultry Testing for County Fair Suspended for 2019

Poultry exhibits (4-H & open class) are normally required to have a blood test in order to participate in the County Fair. This year, there is a shortage of the antigen required for this testing. As a result, the testing is suspended for 2019 for all Fairs and Shows. Questions contact Poultry Superintendent, Pam Montgomery.

Entering the Fair

The Ellis Co. Fair is going electronic! This year you will pre-enter ALL exhibits and participations (showmanship, livestock judging, etc.) through an <u>on-line entry system</u> by July 8. It works with your 4-HOn-line account. The system will print out entry cards, so you won't have to hand write out the cards! There's a <u>help sheet available</u> to help walk you through the process. You will be able to pick up your entry cards to attach them to exhibits ahead of the Fair. Check with the Extension Office by Friday, July 14 to pick up your cards. *(PS – if you misplace these entry tags, you WILL get to hand write the replacements!)*

Ellis County Fair Volunteers Needed

4-H Food Challenge

Seen Chopped on TV? Here's your chance to give this fun food challenge a try. Jr. and Sr. teams of 3—4 members get a set of ingredients (including 1 very unique ingredient) and are asked to create a certain kind of dish (ie. Snack, salad, etc.) This year's there's a beginner category, too. It's a fun and creative team food prep activity. Get your club's team together and join the fun at this year's Fair. Rules for the Food Challenge and the entry form are posted on the <u>Ellis Co.</u> <u>4-H</u> page. We ask one adult to register all members of a club team. Clubs can have multiple teams or members of several clubs can form a team. **Register your club teams by July 1.**

Tags will be sent out with final fair mailing to livestock & small animal families & Superintendents/Asst. Superintendents.

Exhibit Building Early Release Policy

Complete & file an <u>Early Release Form</u> at Fair check in to request early release of 4-H & Open exhibits for exhibit at other area fairs. Early release will be allowed only from 8:00 – 9:00 on Saturday, July 20 and with this written prior approval. Forms are available on-line or at the Ellis County Extension Office. They will also be available at the fairgrounds during check in. **Those choosing to remove exhibits early without an early release form on file will forfeit ALL fair premiums.**

Rocket Kits for Sale

State Fair Exhibitor Handbook

The Kansas State Fair Book is available for review online @ Kansas 4H.

Eligibility for State Fair

If you receive a purple on indoor exhibits or blue on livestock exhibits at County Fair, your item may be eligible for the State Fair. Check with the Schenk Building Office or the Extension Office to review State Fair rules. You must be 9 years of age by January 1, 2019 to show at the State Fair. **Pre-entry is required.** Those important pre-entry dates are:

Livestock – July 15 All Other Projects – July 20

State Fair Entry Information

This year, you will complete the pre-entry process for State Fair eligible exhibits during the Ellis Co. Fair. Watch for specific hours during the week of the fair to sit down with staff and complete your entries. You will pick up your exhibits at the end of the Fair and return them to the Extension Office by the Sept. 4 / Sept. 6 (Food & Hort.) deadlines.

Encampment bed requests are due by September 1 and are filled on a first come, first served basis.

If you are planning to attend the KSF and have members who are exhibiting projects there, 4-H Council has purchased a gate pass for the members. You can also place advance parking and gate pass orders through our office by August 1.

State Fair Volunteers Needed

It is time to recruit committee members to help with the 2019 Kansas State Fair. In order for the Fair to run smoothly, over 50 committees operate with volunteers taking the lead. Duties range from accepting entries, to clerking for judges, to displaying exhibits and assisting with contests and shows. Please contact the Extension Office if you are interested in helping with a specific 4-H area. Youth are welcome to volunteer & must be at least 13 years of age. You will sign up with the Extension Office **by August 1** if you are able to help out. This year the Kansas State Fair will be held September 7 - 16 in Hutchinson, KS. Come join the fun!!!
