4-H Enrollments

You can now update your own 4-H project enrollments! You can add projects or delete them from your list of enrollments until May 1 for all areas, **except Livestock projects**. Those need to be enrolled prior to the weigh-in and identification date set for each specie. To learn more about how to do the updates, <u>click here</u>.

Out of County 4-H Enrollment

If you live outside the Ellis County boundaries, you are required to file an "Out of County 4-H Membership" form annually. Please take time to complete and return this form to the local Extension Office now.

Parents will go through the 4-H Volunteer screening process, families will sign a form agreeing to be positive participants in the program. If currently in another county's program, families must provide a letter of release from the current board stating that they are a family in good standing in their 4-H program. Families will complete and sign the Out of County form and keep their KS 4-H Volunteer Screening file updated annually.

4-H KAP Pilot has Begun!!

Have you set your 4-H project goals for 2021?? If not, now's the time to do so. There's a great form to help you get them in writing. Once you get those goals in writing, visit with your club's KAP trainers to learn how to get started with the new KAP on-line process. All 4-H'ers can build your 4-H project records on-line as you go through the 4-H year. It's an easy to navigate process and one you can use from a smart phone, tablet or computer. We are piloting these forms and the website process, so you may encounter some glitches along the way. The company we are working with will want to hear from you if you do encounter something that isn't working right so they can fix it. We would also like your feedback as you work with this new system. Your feedback will help us to make the forms and process the best it can be as we roll it out statewide in 2022.

4-H Permanent Record is on ZSuite!!

The Permanent Record is a way to track all activities you participate in in 4-H, school and other community organizations. As of this week, it has been added to the forms you will find on your 4-H record book account in Zsuite. It is a pilot form, so remember that if it doesn't work exactly like you think it should, be sure to chat with the tech on the page and let them know what's going on. Now all your record keeping is in one place!!

4-H Day is Coming—Sunday, March 7 – North Oak Community Church - Hays

Mark Sunday, March 7 on your calendar and make plans now to participate in 4-H Day. It will begin early afternoon. 4-H Day is a chance for 4-H members to showcase their project learning through public presentations. If you ask a 4-H alumni what one of the most important things they gained through their 4-H experience, they'll most likely tell you it is their public speaking ability. Consider building that powerful skill in your children through their involvement in 4-H Day activities.

Due to Covid, this year's event will be a little different from years past. There will be a face to face and a virtual participation option this year. You will choose your preferred option as you register. All face to face participants and family members will be required to wear a mask while in the building. 4-H'er may remove their mask while presenting, if they wish. Only judge and immediate family (including grandparents) will be allowed in the room during the presentation. We will schedule entries so that you can come and go in the shortest block of time possible. We are encouraging families to do your presentations, then go onward. We want to keep the number of people in the facility at any given time as low as possible. As we work through this event in new and different ways, let us know what questions you have.

This year's event can be taped live or via zoom. Contact the Ext. Office to schedule your club's participation. The club receiving the top ribbon placing will represent Ellis Co. at Regional 4-H Day via video.

4-H Beef Weigh-in Postponed to February 20 Due to Weather

If you're planning to show Market Steers & Heifers at this year's Ellis County Fair, make plans now to attend the Beef Weigh-in on Saturday, February 20 from 9 – 11 a.m. at the 4-H Fairgrounds. You need to be enrolled in the Market Beef project by February 20. (Check your on-line enrollments) Be sure to purchase tags & tag your animals prior to the weigh-in.

Livestock ID Procedures

Large and Small animal ID procedures for 2021 are unchanged from last year. Please take time to review them.

K-State Animal Sciences Leadership Academy

The ninth annual K-State Animal Sciences Leadership Academy will be held in June at Kansas State University's campus. This four-day event focuses on increasing knowledge of Kansas's diverse livestock industry, as well as building participant's leadership skills. Twenty high school students will be selected to participate based upon educational, community, and agricultural involvement. The event is sponsored by the Livestock and Meat Industry Council. Youth for the Quality Care of Animals (YQCA)

State level livestock shows in Kansas require youth to have YQCA certification. For this year, you will have the option to do the training on line at \$12 per member. Visit YQCA.org to get your training completed for 2021.

JR Producer Weeks for Swine & Meat Goats

This year the junior producer days will be hosted virtually as week-long educational series. A few sessions will be presented on week-night evenings, with the program wrapping up on Saturday morning. Junior Swine Producer Week is scheduled for February 15-20, 2021. The Junior Meat Goat Producer Week is slated for March 15-20, 2021. All ages and knowledge levels are invited for both events! K-State faculty members, graduate students and guest speakers will cover topics including selection, nutrition and feeding, meat science, livestock guard dogs, health, grooming and clipping, showmanship, and the state livestock nomination process.

The program will be free this year, but all attendees, including youth and adults, must register online. The link for Junior Swine Producer Week is https://bit.ly/KSUJrSwineWeek.
