SUPER 4-H SATURDAY Coming to Hays – March 26, 2022

The Annual Super 4-H Saturday NW Judging Contest, which includes Crops, Entomology, Horticulture, Life Skills, Photography and Livestock will be held at Fort Hays State University (FHSU), Hays, Kansas on Saturday, March 26, 2022. Indoor Judging will start at 9:30am and run until noon. You can judge one or all five contests. The Livestock judging registration will start at 12:30pm with contest starting at 1:30pm. The day will also include a Volunteer Gathering/Training in conjunction with the indoor contests. There will be project opportunities offered in conjunction with the Livestock Contest. Small Livestock Weigh-in Date Set for May 11th, 6 – 8 p.m.

If you're planning to show Feeder Calves, Meat Goats, Sheep or Swine at this year's Ellis County Fair, make plans now to get your official 4-H tags and tag your project animals before the weigh-in at the Fairgrounds. New this year, all market animals have the option to weigh their animals. Tags must be verified at weigh-in. The Ellis Co. Spring Livestock Show has been set as an alternate weigh-in date on Sunday, May 22, 7 – 9 a.m. *Please call our office to let us know if you plan to use the alternate date.* Remember, you need to be enrolled in the Market livestock project by May 1. (Check your on-line enrollments)

Youth for the Quality Care of Animals (YQCA—March 13th, 5pm—Ellis County Fairgrounds Mandatory Livestock Sale meeting will follow this training

State level livestock shows in Kansas require youth to have YQCA certification. March 13th, Alicia Boor from Barton County will be conducting the YQCA training. **Please visit YQCA.org to register for this class and pay the \$3.00 fee.** NO money will be collected at the door that evening....You MUST be enrolled BEFORE the class!! If you are planning on selling any livestock at the county fair, there will be a MANDATORY Livestock sale meeting following the YQCA training.



Livestock Nominations Transitioning to an online format

Detailed Information on this process will be posted soon on the K-State Youth Livestock page https://www.asi.k-state.edu/research-and-extension/youth-programs/nominated-livestock/

Main thing is to plan ahead as DNA envelopes will need to be ordered directly through ShoWorks (Old DNA envelopes will not be accepted) and families will enter their animal and exhibitor data online through ShoWorks. Cost per animal has increased to \$12.00. DNA envelope orders will close 1 week prior to the nomination deadline for each specie. (April 24th for market beef and June 8th for small livestock). You will still need to mail the signed DNA samples by the following deadlines:

May 1 Market beef/heifer nominations due for KS State fair and KJLS June 15 commercial heifer/market/commercial swine, market goat and market/commercial lamb nominations for KS State fair and KJLS are due

4-H Horse Level Testing

The Level 1 Achievement test is required for all youth to participate in District and State Horse Shows. Online/video levels testing will be accepted again this year. Learn more and prepare for the Level 1 tests, visit the <u>4-H Horse Project page.</u>

4-H HORSE ID PAPERS DUE MAY 1

Horse ID papers are available at the Extension Office or on line at kansas4-h.org. You have to have these papers completed and on file with our office by May 1 in order to show at 4-H sanctioned horse shows. Now's the time to get the photos taken and the forms filed with the Extension Office. If you have an old form, you should transition to the form linked above.
