4-H ENROLLMENTS

The 4-H Online enrollment system is updated and ready for you to sign on starting October 1 to update your enrollment choices for 2024 -25. Even if you are enrolling in the same projects, you will still need to log-on and update your profile and make project selections.

The \$15 fee per member is payable to the KS 4-H program as you enroll. Your enrollment is not considered complete until you make a payment and hit the **SUBMIT** button. You can pay by credit card or by check to the State 4-H Office. **Payments do not come to the local Extension Office**. If this fee is a hardship for your family, you can select the "Request a Waiver" button and the State 4-H Office will consider your request.

This will be the last month that we will send out the newsletter notification email to both last year and this year's email list.

You will be able to add projects or delete them from your list of enrollments until May 1 for all areas, **except Livestock projects**. Those need to be enrolled prior to the weigh-in and identification date set for each specie. I.e. Market Beef is usually weighed in early February and Small Livestock weighed in in late April/early May.

4-H ADULT VOLUNTEERS

4-H volunteers working directly with youth in the club, as a leader or project leader are required to go through this screening and training process. The training module is available as part of the 4-H Online website. You will complete a profile for yourself under your family account.

Contact the Ext. Office to let us know you've completed these steps to schedule an interview. At that time, we will provide you with a link to the background check process.

National Criminal Background Checks—Kansas 4-H requires background checks for all volunteers. All volunteers will be required to go through this process every 3 years.

Returning Volunteers - If you are a current screened volunteer in your 4-H club and plan to continue to do so, please UPDATE YOUR INFORMATION on the 4-H On-line system as your 4-H Volunteer Renewal.

New Volunteers – *will need to add yourself to your family profile in 4-H On-line.* Visit with your club's leader or our office if you need assistance with this!

K-STATE JUNIOR PRODUCER DAYS 2025 DATES ANNOUNCED

We are excited to announce the dates for the 2025 K-State Junior Producer Days!

The Junior Swine Producer Day will be Saturday, March 1. Tentative topics range from selection to health, and showmanship. The deadline to register is February 5. The cost is \$20/person by the deadline, or \$25 after. Only those

registered by February 5 will receive a t-shirt. Attendance will also be limited to the first 400 participants to register.

The Junior Meat Goat Producer Day will be hosted Saturday, March 22. Tentative topics include selection to nutrition, and showmanship. Registration is due February 26 and will be capped at 400 participants. The cost is \$20/person and t-shirts are only guaranteed for those who sign up by the deadline. Late registrations will be \$25/person. All youth, parents, leaders and extension agents are invited to participate in these one-day, family educational experiences. K-State faculty members, graduate students, veterinarians, extension agents, guest speakers and former exhibitors will provide the sessions. There will also be an optional instructor-led YQCA training at the conclusion of the program for both events, as well as a session over the state nomination process.
