WINTER WEATHER & 4-H ACTIVITIES

Our policy is that if school cancels for weather related events, 4-H events are canceled, too. Please check our website or contact the person in charge before traveling in, if you are in doubt about the status of an event.

4-H PROJECT ENROLLMENT

You must be enrolled in 4-H to participate at any 4-H event or activity. You are able to add projects or delete them from your list of enrollments until May 1 for all areas, **except Livestock projects and shooting sports projects**. Those need to be enrolled prior to the weigh-in and identification date set for each specie or the start of the shooting sports practice. I.e. Market Beef will be Feb. 1st and Small Livestock weighed in will be April 30th.

4-H BEEF WEIGH-IN & TAGGING

If you're planning to show Market Beef at this year's Ellis County Fair, make plans now to attend the Beef Weigh-in and Tagging on <u>Saturday, February 1st from 1 – 2 p.m. at Hillside Vet Clinic.</u> See map with directions on last page. You must be enrolled in the Market Beef project prior to weigh-in. (Please check your on-line enrollments)

Other Animals (Commercial Breeding Dairy Goats, Ewes, Heifers, & Swine PLUS Feeder & Bucket Calves) can come to small animal weigh-in that will take place at the Fairgrounds on April 30th from 6-8 PM.

EID tags will NOT be sold before hand, tagging and weighing will take place at the same place and time. **On February 1**st **from 1-2 PM, beef should be brought to HILLSIDE vet clinic.**

***Please note that if a customer comes into the clinic during this time, we will be asked to step aside.

Families are asked to come into the office and pay for tags during the week of February 3rd-7th. Any remaining invoices will be mailed out after February 10th. Checks should be made out to Ellis County 4-H Ag Livestock.

EVENT SCHOLARSHIP AVAILABLE

The 4-H Scholarship and Development Committee has funds available for all Ellis County 4-H members. The <u>Event</u> Scholarship Application can be completed to attend any event that would benefit youth. Events can include 4-H camps,

livestock clinics, shooting sports competitions, and more that would help youth build on their skills. Members should complete the application and turn into the office 2 weeks before the event registration in due.

STATE 4-H SCHOLARSHIPS DUE MARCH 1

Get an early start on your application for the 2025 Kansas 4-H Scholarship. A list of scholarships available to apply for is posted on the site. The KS 4-H Scholarship requires a copy of your grade transcript, resume, several letters of recommendation, an essay and a short video, so plan ahead! Any past 4-H member who is currently in college is eligible to apply for the KS 4-H scholarships. You are considered for all scholarships that you qualify for with one application. State scholarship aps are due March 1, 2025.

K- STATE JUNIOR PRODUCER DAYS 2025

The Junior Swine Producer Day will be Saturday, March 1. Tentative topics range from selection to health, and showmanship. The deadline to register is February 5. The cost is \$20/person by the deadline, or \$25 after. Only those registered by February 5 will receive a t-shirt. Attendance will also be limited to the first 400 participants to register.

The Junior Meat Goat Producer Day will be hosted Saturday, March 22. Tentative topics include selection to nutrition, and showmanship. Registration is due February 26 and will be capped at 400 participants. The cost is \$20/person and t-shirts are only guaranteed for those who sign up by the deadline. Late registrations will be \$25/person.

All youth, parents, leaders and extension agents are invited to participate in these one-day, family educational experiences. K-State faculty members, graduate students, veterinarians, extension agents, guest speakers and former

exhibitors will provide the sessions. There will also be an optional instructor-led YQCA training at the conclusion of the program for both events, as well as a session over the state nomination process.
