The application for the 2025 Kansas 4-H Scholarship is **due on Monday March 3<sup>rd</sup> by 11:59 PM**. A list of scholarships available to apply for is posted on the site. The KS 4-H Scholarship requires a copy of your grade transcript, resume, several letters of recommendation, an essay and a short video, so plan ahead! Any past 4-H member who is currently in college is eligible to apply for the KS 4-H scholarships. **You are considered for all scholarships that you qualify for with one application**.

# **SMALL LIVESTOCK WEIGH-IN & TAGGING**

If you're planning to show Commercial Breeding animals, Feeder/Bucket Calves, Meat Goats, Sheep or Swine at this year's Ellis County Fair, make plans now to attend weigh-in and tagging on **April 30**<sup>th</sup> **from 6-8 PM at the Fairgrounds**.

EID tags will NOT be sold before hand, tagging and weighing will take place at the same place and time. All animals have the option to weigh their animals. Remember, you need to be enrolled in the Market livestock project by May 1.

Families are asked to come into the office and **pay for tags during the week of May 5th-9th.** Any remaining invoices will be mailed out after May 12th. Checks should be made out to **Ellis County 4-H Ag Livestock.** 

# K-STATE INVITATIONAL MEAT JUDGING CONTEST

Kansas State University is hosting an invitational meat judging contest at the Weber Hall Meat Lab on April 5<sup>th</sup>. The contest will include 6 classes, 2 sets of questions and 40 retail identification. After the contest there will be an educational walk through. Registration starts at 7 am with the contest beginning at 8 am. Prizes will be awarded to the top 10 individuals and highest placing team. Cost is \$15 before March 21<sup>st</sup> and \$25 after that until April 1<sup>st</sup>.

# YQCA TRAINING & MANDATORY SALE MEETING – April 6th, 1:30pm – Ag Research Center

On April 6<sup>th</sup>, Stacy Campbell will be conducting an in-person YQCA training. **This training is required for all youth** planning to participate in the Ellis County 4-H Livestock Auction, exhibit in the Kansas State Fair Grand Drive and/or KJLS. This is an annual training, so youth need to complete it each year.

For 2025, you have two options to complete the training:

- In-Person Training on April 6th.
  - o If you cannot attend the in-person session on April 6th, you are welcome to attend an in-person training in another county. Please notify the Extension Office that you will be doing this.
- Online Training for \$12 per member.

Important Registration Details: To register, visit <u>yqcaprogram.org</u>. There, you can:

- Register for the class
- Pay the \$3.00 fee
- Complete the PRE-TEST

Please note that NO payment will be accepted at the door. You must be enrolled and complete the pre-test before attending the class.

Mandatory Livestock Sale Meeting: Immediately following the YQCA training, there will be a MANDATORY Livestock Sale Meeting. This meeting is essential for all participants, and there will not be another opportunity to attend. It is important that both youth and a parent are present.

#### LIVESTOCK NOMINATIONS

Detailed Information on this process will be posted on the K-State Youth Livestock webpage.

Plan ahead as DNA envelopes will need to be ordered directly through ShoWorks (Old DNA envelopes will not be accepted) and families will enter their animal and exhibitor data online through ShoWorks. DNA envelope orders will close 1 week prior to the nomination deadline for each specie. (**April 20**<sup>th</sup> **for market beef and June 5**<sup>th</sup> **for small livestock**). You will still need to mail the signed DNA samples by the following deadlines:

May 1 - Market beef/heifer nominations due for KS State fair and KJLS

June 15 - Commercial heifer/market/commercial swine, market goat and market/commercial lamb nominations for KS State fair and KJLS are due



# 4-H HORSE ID PAPERS DUE JUNE 1

Horse ID papers are available at the Extension Office or on line at <u>kansas4-h.org</u>. You have to have these papers completed and on <u>file with our office by JUNE 1</u> in order to show at 4-H sanctioned horse shows. Now's the time to get the photos taken and the forms filed with the Extension Office.

If you have an old form, you will need to transition to the form linked above. It has been updated for the 2025 program year!

# 4-H HORSE COGGINS TEST REQUIRED AT FAIR

All exhibits in the 4-H Horse Show must present proof of negative Coggins test within the last 12 months at check-in. If you are needing the test completed please reach out to our office and we will work with a local vet to get it completed.


