KANSAS STATE FAIR

KANSAS STATE FAIR EXHIBITS

Watch the Hays Arts Council Main street window for your state fair exhibits to be on display starting October 1st through the 24th. Exhibits that are on display for National 4-H week will be at the Achievement Banquet on October 25th for pick up. After that, they will return to the Extension Office. **We ask that everything be picked up by November 3rd.**

4-H YOUTH ENROLLMENTS

Welcome to the New 4-H year! The 4-H Online enrollment system is open now to update your enrollment choices for 2024 - 25. *Even if you are enrolling in the same projects, you will still need to log-on and update your profile and make project selections.* Please use the same email from last year to login to your account!

The \$15 fee per member is payable to the KS 4-H program as you enroll. Your enrollment is not considered complete until you make a payment and hit the SUBMIT button. You can pay by credit card or by check to the State 4-H Office. Payments do not come to the local Extension Office. If this fee is a hardship for your family, you can select the "Request a Waiver" button and the State 4-H Office will consider your request. Your enrollment is not complete until you have successfully paid the \$15 fee.

We ask that you take time this month to complete this process and have everything finalized ASAP.

You will be able to add projects or delete them from your list of enrollments until May 1 for all areas, **except Livestock and shooting sports projects**. Those need to be enrolled prior to the weigh-in and identification date set for each specie or before the first SS practice. I.e. Market Beef is usually weighed in early February and Small Livestock weighed in in late April/early May.

4-H ADULT VOLUNTEERS

4-H volunteers working directly with youth in the club, as a leader or project leader are required to go through this screening and training process. The training module is available as part of the 4-H Online website. You will complete a profile for yourself under your family account.

Contact the Ext. Office to let us know you've completed these steps to schedule an interview. At that time, we will provide you with a link to the background check process.

Current & Returning Volunteers - If you are a current screened volunteer in your 4-H club and plan to continue to do so, please **UPDATE YOUR INFORMATION** on the 4-H Online system by **November 1**.

New Volunteers – will need to add yourself to your family profile in 4-H On-line. This document can help walk through that process, New Adult Volunteer Enrollment Guide.pdf. Contact our office if you need assistance with this!
