The Conservation Awards program or "Banker's Awards" as they are commonly known are coming up soon and your feedback is needed. The intent of this program is to stimulate a greater interest in the preservation of agricultural and natural resources in Kansas by giving recognition to those farmers and landowners who have made outstanding progress implementing conservation methods on their farms.

Any producer that has worked on a conservation effort is eligible for nomination for their diligence. Awards will be presented in the following categories: water quality, water conservation, soil conservation, windbreaks, and wildlife habitat.
